Design

esign is about developing projects with the goal of making and producing an object or a system. Design has two main branches: creative design (expression of art) and industrial design (marketing instrument).

At the crossroads of art, technology and society, design deals with aesthetic, functional, technical and environmental aspects, as well as cultural, social, and economic outcomes. Design is a critical component of the economic performance and competitiveness of companies.

Design continues to expand in all sectors of the economy, with strong growth in the hospitality, restaurant, and retail sectors. A testament to this is the "Commerce Design" competition held by the Chambers of Commerce and Industry of Lyon, Marseille, and Saint-Etienne, as well as the "Paris Shop & Design."

With its strong scientific and cultural environment and regional dynamism, France has diverse and unique design programs that enjoy global recognition. French design schools maintain close ties with major R&D laboratories and six competitiveness clusters (pôles de compétitivité): Cap Digital (global cluster in Ile de France), Végépolys (global cluster in Pays de la Loire), Matiken (Nord-Pas-de-Calais), Mov'éo (Haute Normandie), Pôle Véhicule du Future (Alsace), Pôle Européen de la Céramique (Limousin).

Since 1999, France has been a world leader in industrial innovation through design. Numerous companies are investing in this area. France has also attracted international designers, such as Neil Poulton (Scotland), Jasper Morrison (England), Arik Levy (Israel), and Kue Ho (Taiwan). French institutions such as Lieu du Design, the ACPI (agency for the promotion of industrial design), and Cité du Design form networks with various actors in the design sector and organize major events in France and abroad, such as "Observeur du Design" (which holds over 50 shows abroad and is labeled as an "International Competition" by the ISCID, or International Council of Societies of Industrial Design). "France Design," "Paris Design Week," the "Designer Day's" festival in Paris, and the "Design Parade" in Hyères. Each year, the "Biennale Internationale Design Sainte-Etienne" invites 15.000 students to explore and present projects of the future. Most French design schools are part of the "Cumulus" international network and have frequent exchanges with their international counterparts.

Licence level

Students apply to the first year at a public École Supérieure d'Art (ESA) or Ecole Supérieure d'Arts Appliqués (ESAA) through a competitive process in which applicants submit a portfolio of their artistic work. In order to be admitted, many students are required to complete a one-year preparatory program (Mise à Niveau en Arts Appliqués, or MANAA). Admissions in mid-curriculum are possible if the applicant can prove equivalent personal and professional experience.

Some private schools award credentials listed on the national registry of occupational certifications (RNCP).

Tuition charges at many private schools are very high.

Brevet de Technicien Supérieur (BTS, higher technical certificate)

(Secondary diploma + 2 years of higher education) - L2

BTS, offered in public and private secondary and postsecondary schools. Options include: Architectural environmental design; Planning; Audiovisual; Communication design; Fashion and textile design; Product design; Ceramics industry; Spatial design; Web design. These programs are designed to rapidly prepare students to enter the workforce.

Diplôme des Métiers d'Arts (DMA) (Secondary diploma + 2 years of higher education) – L2

 DMA, a 2-year degree offered by over 40 public ESSA (Boulle, Olivier de Serres, Duperré) or public secondary schools. Students focus on one art/craft and learn to use traditional know-how in the professional world. Various options are available: furnishings, ceramics, textiles, etc.

Diplôme National d'Art (DNA) (Secondary diploma + 3 years of higher education) – L3

 DNA, awarded after 3 years of study at an École Supérieure d'Art (180 ECTS credits). Around 20 schools offer the Design option with some allowing a concentration (spatial, textile, graphic or product design, etc.).

Licence

(Secondary diploma + 3 years of higher education) - L3

• Licence Professionnelle, a national diploma awarded after 1 year of study (60 ETCS credits) and offered by around 20 schools under the broad fields of Arts, Letters, and Languages or Sciences, Technologies, and Health. It offers students technical mastery in one specialty area: Graphic design, Sound design, Textile design, 3D modeling, Packaging design, Web design.

Master level

Master 2

(Secondary diploma + 5 years of higher education) - M2

- Diplôme National Supérieur d'Expression Plastique (DNSEP), a 2-year degree (120 ECTS credits) that caps the graduate phase of art education in France and aims to impart structure and strength to the student's personal research. 24 schools offer the Art option with some allowing a concentration (spatial design, culinary design, sound design, etc.).
- Diplôme Supérieur des Arts Appliqués (DSAA), a 2-year degree (120 ECTS credits) that caps the graduate phase of art education in France. 38 schools offer the Design option, often with a concentration (spatial design, graphic design, fashion and product design, etc.).
- Master, a 2-year national diploma (120 ECTS credits) offered by around 20 universities under the broad fields of Arts, Letters, and Languages; Law, Economics, Management; Humanities and Social Sciences; or Sciences, Technologies, and Health with various concentrations (design, IT, urban planning, acoustics, interactive design, etc.) Master Prospectives Design, offered by the IAE at the Ecole des Mines and the ESAD of Saint-Étienne. www.univ-stetienne.fr
- 2 Master, under the broad field of Sciences, Technologies, and Health with a concentration in global design, conferred by the Ecole Nationale Supérieure d'Architecture of Nancy (ENSA). www.nancy.archi.fr
