

DEGREES

SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH

The purpose of this collection is to promote major areas of French research: agronomy, archaeology, biology, climatology, chemistry, mathematics, nanotechnologies, neuroscience, physics, sociology, and more. It covers cross-disciplinary fields as well: biotechnology, environmental studies, musicology, renewable energy, and more. KEY FIGURES

An annual publication, Campus France's "Key Figures" is an analytical and comparative survey of major trends in student mobility in France and the world. This reference tool tracks changes in every type of mobility (inbound/outbound; degree programs/exchanges) and connects them to countries' strategies for attracting international students.



REGIONAL

Dynamics

Each publication in the "Regional Dynamics" collection describes the current state of higher education, international student mobility, and cooperative programs in a specific geographical area.

NOTES

Each of the "Notes" sheds light on an aspect of student mobility. The revival of distance education, doctoral mobility in France, and the hosting of refugees in France are three examples of recent analyses produced by Campus France.

Brief Notes

It describes the major features of the country's higher education system and the promotional and cooperative directions that are likely to be emphasized, thus enabling those active in student mobility to target their partnership efforts more effectively.

Through the observatory, Campus France is providing a wealth of previously unpublished assessments rich in valuable lessons.
