Gustave Eiffel was a major French engineer and industrialist who gave his name to the most emblematic monument in Paris.


He is the embodiment of French excellence.

Developed and financed by the French Ministry of Foreign Affairs and managed by Campus France, the Eiffel scholarship programme is a source of success, prestige, knowledge and innovation. It aims to develop the attractiveness of French higher education and research institutions and assist talented international students in pursuing their studies in France. Recipients of the scholarship are pre-selected by their institution and awarded by a jury of experts.

#### **Timeline**

- Online call for applications: end of September
- Deadline for institutions to send applications to Campus France: 1st week of January
- Publication of results: March

### Important notice

The cooperation and cultural action network of French diplomatic missions can assist institutions in identifying and selecting the best students in their host countries.

The Campus France offices can provide information to students on training programmes in France and help them outline their educational goals.

#### Note

Tuition fees are not covered by the Eiffel programme.

Students who are recipients of a French government scholarship are exempt from paying.

### METICULOUS SELECTION OF EIFFEL PROGRAMME RECIPIENTS

### Selection criteria

Candidate's track record of excellence.

The institution's reputation abroad and its international student policy.

Policy of cooperation and partnership with the French Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

#### Eligibility criteria

The programme is reserved for international students. Candidates with dual nationality. one of which is French, are not eligible. Only programmes that confer a nationally accredited degree are allowed. French programmes located abroad will not be accepted. Programmes part of an apprenticeship contract are ineligible (contrat d'apprentissage, contrat de professionnalisation).

### **Applications**

Host French institutions commit to register awardees in the programme for which they were selected.

#### Graduate level

- Candidates currently studying in France are ineligible.
- Graduate level programmes, including engineering diplomas, are eligible.

Note: French programmes located abroad will not be accepted. Programmes part of an apprenticeship contract are ineligible (contrat d'apprentissage, contrat de professionnalisation).

#### Post-graduate level

- Students currently studying abroad are a priority over those who currently reside in France.
- The award of a 36-month scholarship is reserved for first-year PhD students registering for the first time in France.

Note: Students who are currently recipients of a French government scholarship are not eligible. However, institutions may present PhD applications for candidates who have benefitted from graduate-level scholarships in the past.
