

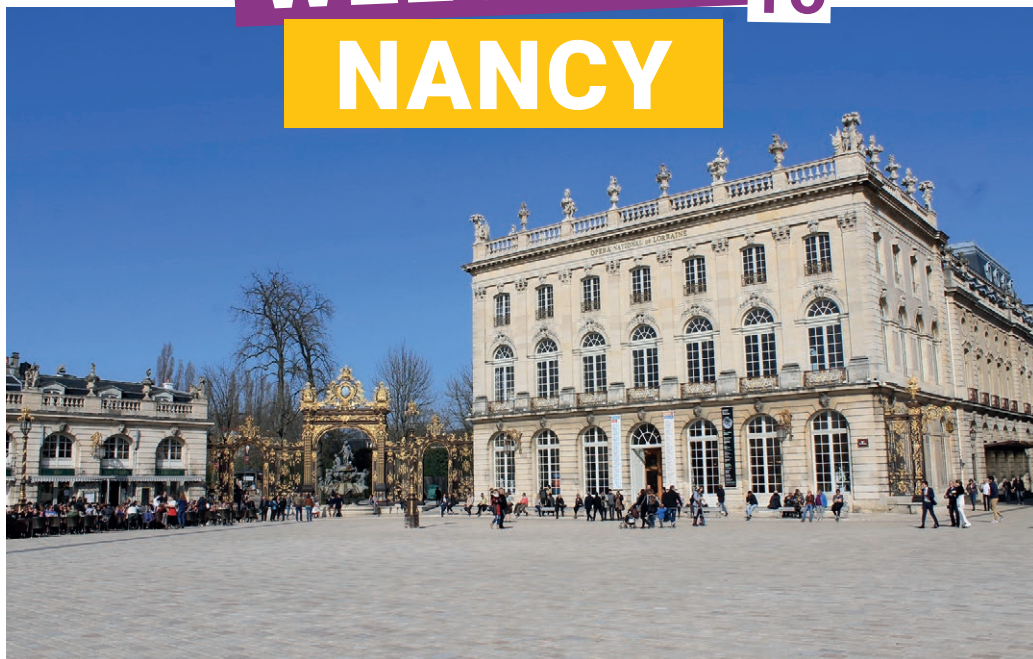

YOUR ARRIVAL IN NANCY /

- ♦ **The International Welcome Desk (Accueil International)** is open year-round for **Université de Lorraine** students.

At **Université de Lorraine** on the **Nancy** site, the **International Welcome Desk (Accueil International)** is a one-stop information desk. You will find information on day-to-day life and administrative procedures before, during, and at the end of your stay.

It is the place to go for carrying out many of the required administrative procedures, which can be completed on the spot. These include applications for residence permits, in partnership with the **Prefecture of Meurthe-et-Moselle**.

In addition, a **Welcome Desk** is provided all year round on the premises of the **Direction des Relations internationales et européennes**, to support you via video conference, email or telephone, in order to assist you with online procedures (CVEC, validation of your visa, signing up for French social security, applying for a residence permit, applying for housing benefit etc.).

ACCOMMODATION

Finding somewhere to live is not always easy.

Rents are often high, and landlords require financial guarantees (such as a deposit). Nevertheless, there is a wide range of accommodation on offer: halls of residence that are exclusively reserved for students and managed by the CROUS, student halls and private lodgings, rooms in private homes, flatshares...

The main thing is to start preparing for this as early as possible, before leaving your home country.

GETTING AROUND IN NANCY



The easiest way to get from Paris to Nancy is to take the train (1½ hrs by the TGV high-speed train). **To get to the International Welcome Desk (Accueil International) from the Nancy train station, take the Corol-C2 bus towards Plateau de Haye and get off at the Cavalier stop.**



For getting around the city and suburbs, use the public transportation (bus and tramway) network, managed by Stan for transportation in Nancy: <http://www.reseau-stan.com>

The CROUS, at your service everywhere

The CROUS (Centre Régional des Œuvres Universitaires et Scolaires - Regional Centre of University and School Services) has branches in all major French university towns.

It manages university halls of residence and canteens, allows you to meet social workers, and offers cultural activities and job opportunities.



FIRST THINGS FIRST /

ENROLLMENT IN YOUR INSTITUTION

♦ CVEC

Before you can enroll in your institution, you must download proof of payment of the Contribution Vie Etudiante et de Campus (CVEC) – the student and campus life contribution fee.

♦ Confirm Registration

Take note! Even if you have a pre-registration letter, you are not officially enrolled. You must confirm your enrollment with your institution's Service de la Scolarité (Admissions) as soon as you arrive.

RESIDENCE PERMITS

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

• If you have just arrived in France on a long-term VLS-TS student visa: you must **validate it online as soon as you arrive in France**, on the ANEF (Administration numérique pour les Etrangers en France - Digital Administration for Foreigners in France) website. This validation must be carried out within the three months following your arrival: <https://administration-etrangers-en-france.interieur.gouv.fr/particuliers/#/>

• If you have Algerian citizenship or you are a student holding a “concours” visa or a visa bearing the mention “carte à solliciter dans les deux mois” (“card to be requested within two months”): your request for a residence permit must be carried out at the Préfecture.

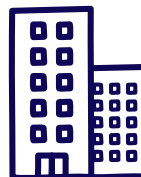
• If you hold a “mineur scolarisé” (“minor in education”) visa and you have since attained your majority, you must request a residence permit directly on the ANEF website or at the *préfecture* of your place of residence within the two months following your attaining the age of legal majority: <https://administration-etrangers-en-france.interieur.gouv.fr/particuliers/#/>

Please note: if you wish to renew your residence permit or VLS-TS, you must make your request during the third month preceding the date of end of validity of your current residence permit, on the following website: <https://administration-etrangers-en-france.interieur.gouv.fr/particuliers/#/>

PRACTICAL INFORMATION /

OPENING A BANK ACCOUNT

If you stay in France for more than 3 months, it will be much easier day-to-day if you open a bank account, **online or in one of the bank agencies located in Nancy.**

In France, opening a bank account is a right:

ACCESSING HEALTHCARE

Accessing healthcare in France is almost free, but you must be insured. **You must therefore be registered with the national health insurance programme.**

As a student, you can also take advantage of the university medical services. In these health centers where consultations are free, you will be greeted by a team of doctors and nurses who can give personalized advice about health and prevention.

TAKING OUT COMPLEMENTARY HEALTH INSURANCE ("MUTUELLE")

We recommend you take out complementary health insurance in order to cover the totality of your healthcare costs, which are not all covered

by the compulsory and free national health insurance programme.

Please note: options and levels of insurance vary from one insurer to another. In order to choose the complementary insurance that is best adapted to your situation and your budget, you can access more information on a student "mutuelles" price comparison website.

INSURE YOUR HOME

In France, housing insurance is mandatory.

The "garantie risques locatifs" - rental risk guarantee - is housing insurance which you can subscribe with your bank or a private insurance company. Online subscription is also often possible.

EMERGENCY NUMBERS

SAMU: Call 15 Emergency Medical Services

Police emergency: Call 17 in the event of violence, theft, robbery.

Fire Department: Call 18 in the event of fire, gas leak, water damage, natural catastrophe, or traffic accident.

Call 112: European emergency services number that's accessible from anywhere in the European Union in addition to the French numbers above.

LEARNING FRENCH

Learning French is an opportunity that's not to be missed! Find what works best for you:

FINDING A JOB OR WORK EXPERIENCE PLACEMENT

It is important that you have sufficient financial resources to come and study in France.

Working in France as a foreign student is possible within limits, namely for a maximum duration of 964 hours per year. This can therefore only be a way of earning **supplementary funds.**

Please note: to work in France, if you are not a citizen of the European Union, you must hold a valid **student residence permit**.

• In the area of culture, the **Ville de Nancy** has set up a system of subscriptions and discounts, a **Carte Jeunes Nancy Culture** (Nancy culture youth card) and free offers that are available to everyone: <https://www.nancy.fr> > culturelle > culture à Nancy > tarifs et bons plans

• **At Université de Lorraine**, the Direction de la vie universitaire et de la culture, the university student life and culture department, develops an ambitious cultural strategy for all students: <https://www.univ-lorraine.fr> > culture-s

• For entertainment or to pick up some culture, you can choose from:

- 6 movie theaters, with multiple screens (student rates, rewards card), including 2 arthouse movie theaters, the Cameo Commanderie and the San Sebastián.
- 10 major museums, including two that are jointly managed by Université de Lorraine and the Métropole du Grand Nancy (Greater Nancy council): the Botanical Garden and the Museum-Aquarium <http://www.jardinbotaniquedenancy.eu>
- a dozen auditoriums, including the National Opera of Lorraine, one of the five French national opera houses, and a more contemporary room for modern music, the Autre Canal.
- about fifteen bookshops, including a historic institution, Hall du Livre, founded in 1925.

TOP ATTRACTIONS /

Three major architectural complexes in Nancy have been listed as World Heritage sites by UNESCO since 1983.

- Place Stanislas, a majestic square with its wrought iron and gilded gates.
- Place de la Carrière, a long piazza formerly used for equestrian tournaments and games.
- The Museum of Fine Arts, on Stanislas Square, with an exceptional collection of Daum crystal exhibits.

- The Renaissance styled Ducal Palace, which houses the historical museum of Lorraine.
- The museum of the School of Nancy, which offers an overview of the decorative arts (Art Nouveau) movement that grew in Nancy at the end of the 19th century.
- The Villa Majorelle, the architectural jewel of the Art Nouveau movement.
- The Parc de la Pépinière, the largest park in the city
- The recently created water garden on the banks of the Meurthe

APRIL

- **Journées des Arts et de la Culture (JACES), the Festival of Art and Culture**, promoting cultural and artistic achievements in higher education and student night at the museums (free admissions): <https://www.univ-lorraine.fr> > culture-s > Culture – Arts > JACES 2019
- Biannual Nancy international image show, with photography-related events.

MAY

- **Pint of Science**, a European initiative for learning about research in atypical venues.
- The Nuit Européenne des Musées (European Museum Night), an occasion to visit museums differently (and for free).
- Nancy Voix du Monde, an international gathering of choral singing performances.

JUNE

- **Fête de la Musique**: Music everywhere in town (free concerts).

JULY - AUGUST

- The rendez-vous Place Stanislas, provides a sound, image and light show on the royal square (free show, every night).

SEPTEMBER

- **Welcome Days** for international students (organised at the start of each semester in Nancy and in Metz).
- **Préambule, the University of Lorraine Freshers' Festival**.
- **Nocturnes étudiantes** (student nightlife festival), free events and concerts.

- The Journées du Patrimoine (heritage days), offering free admissions to sites of cultural heritage, some of which are only open to the public for this event.

- The Livre sur la Place (book on the piazza), a major national show celebrating the literature at the start of the University year (exhibitions, literary cafes, meetings).

OCTOBER

- **Fête de la Science** in the University laboratories.
- Nancy Jazz Pulsations, a jazz festival of contemporary music and world music.

NOVEMBER

- Faim d'Échanges (Hungry for Dialogue) is a friendly rendezvous organized by CROUS de Lorraine to share a meal with residents of Nancy or the surrounding area: <https://www.crous-lorraine.fr> > International > Faim d'échanges-Nancy

DECEMBER

- The Feast of Saint-Nicolas, an important traditional festival of Lorraine with events, street performances, parades, markets, etc.
