◆ Student Welcome at Université de La Réunion

At Université de la Réunion, the Direction des Relations Internationales (DRI) is responsible for supporting international students who are attending the university within the framework of an official exchange programme.

The Direction des Etudes et du Pilotage des Formations (DEPF) is responsible for supporting international students who have come to the university as free movers (outside the framework of a structured programme).

A Welcome Day and a Thursday Campus Tour will be organised to introduce you to the university, help you with your administrative procedures and support your integration.

Students who have come to the university as part of an exchange programme may be entitled to an individual pick-up at the airport (depending on their day and time of arrival).

ACCOMMODATION

Finding somewhere to live is not always easy.

Rents are often high, and landlords require financial guarantees (such as a deposit).

Nevertheless, there is a wide range of accommodation

on offer: halls of residence that are exclusively reserved for students and managed by the CROUS, student halls and private lodgings, rooms in private homes. flatshares

The main thing is to start preparing for this as early as possible, before leaving your home country.

GO GETTING AROUND ON LA RÉUNION



La Réunion has 2 airports (close to St-Denis and St-Pierre):

- in the North, Roland Garros airport in Saint-Denis, the main airport on the island: https://www.reunion.aeroport.fr/ A shuttle service provides transport between the airport and the bus station in St-Denis every day.

- in the South, Pierrefonds airport in St-Pierre mainly offers regional flights within the Indian Ocean: http://www.pierrefonds.aeroport.fr/

The CROUS, at your service everywhere

The CROUS (Centre Régional des Œuvres Universitaires et Scolaires

- Regional Centre of University and

School Services) has branches in all major French university towns.

It manages university halls of residence and canteens, allows you to meet social workers, and offers cultural activities and job opportunities.



ENROLLMENT IN YOUR INSTITUTION

CVEC

Before you can enroll in your institution, you must download proof of payment of the Contribution Vie Etudiante et de Campus (CVEC) - the student and campus life contribution fee.

◆ Confirm Registration

Take note! Even if you have a pre-registration letter, you are not officially enrolled. You must confirm vour enrollment with the institution's Service de la Scolarité (Admissions) as soon as you arrive.

RESIDENCE PERMITS

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- If you have just arrived in France on a longterm VLS-TS student visa: you must validate it online as soon as you arrive in France, on the ANEF (Administration numérique pour les Etrangers en France - Digital Administration for Foreigners in France) website. This validation must be carried out within the three months. following your arrival: https://administrationetrangers-en-france.interieur.gouv.fr/ particuliers/#/
- · If you have Algerian citizenship or you are a student holding a "concours" visa or a visa bearing the mention "carte à solliciter dans les deux mois" ("card to be requested within two months"): your request for a residence permit must be carried out at the Préfecture.
- · If you hold a "mineur scolarisé" ("minor in education") visa and you have since attained your majority, you must request a residence permit directly on the ANEF website or at the préfecture of vour place of residence within the two months following your attaining the age of legal majority: https://administrationetrangers-en-france.interieur.gouv.fr/ particuliers/#/

Please note: if you wish to renew your residence permit or VLS-TS, you must make your request during the third month preceding the date of end of validity of your current residence permit, on the following website: https://administrationetrangers-en-france.interieur.gouv.fr/ particuliers/#/

OPENING A BANK ACCOUNT

If you stay in France for more than 3 months, it will be much easier day-to-day if you open a bank account, online or in one of the bank agencies located in La Réunion.

In France, opening a bank account is a right: www.service-public.fr > Argent > Comptes bancaires (Droit au compte).

ACCESSING HEALTHCARE

Accessing healthcare in France is almost free, but you must be insured. You must therefore be registered with the national health insurance programme.

As a student, you can also take advantage of the university medical services. In these health services where consultations are free, you'll be greeted by a team of doctors, nurses, and social workers who can give personalized advice in terms of health and prevention.

This is the case at Université de la Réunion which has a preventive health center, Service Universitaire de Médecine Préventive et de Promotion de la Santé (SUMPPS), at two university sites: https://www.univ-reunion.fr > Vie étudiante > Santé > Centre de santé.

International students must go for a mandatory health check-up when they arrive at Université de La Réunion.

TAKING OUT COMPLEMENTARY HEALTH INSURANCE ("MUTUELLE")

We recommend you take out complementary health insurance in order to cover the totality of

your healthcare costs, which are not all covered by the compulsory and free national health insurance programme.

Please note: options and levels of insurance vary from one insurer to another. In order to choose the complementary insurance that is best adapted to your situation and your budget, you can access more information on a student "mutuelles" price comparison website.

HOUSING INSURANCE

In France, housing insurance is mandatory.

The "garantie risques locatifs" - rental risk guarantee - is housing insurance which you can you subscribe with your bank or a private insurance company. Online subscription is also often possible.

FINDING A JOB OR WORK EXPERIENCE PLACEMENT

It is important that you have sufficient financial resources to come and study in France.

Working in France as a foreign student is possible within limits, namely for a maximum duration of 964

hours per year. This can therefore only be a way of earning **supplementary funds**.

Please note: to work in France, if you are not a citizen of the European Union, you must hold a valid **student residence permit.**

TOP ATTRACTIONS /

St-Denis in the North, St-Paul in the West and St-Pierre/St-Louis in the South were recognized in 2011 as "Cities and Districts of Art and History". Parc National de La Réunion has been listed as a Natural World Heritage site by UNESCO.

- Hôtel de Ville in St-Pierre, built as a store by the French East India Company, is an example of 18th century colonial construction.
- Isautier distillery in St-Pierre, the oldest family-run distillery on the island, established in 1845, with the Saga du Rhum, Réunion's only rum museum (to be enjoyed with moderation).
- Cité des Arts in St-Denis, a multidisciplinary arts village, dedicated to the culture of Réunion.
- Jardin de l'État in St-Denis, formerly used for acclimatizing plant species imported to Réunion.
- St-Paul market, one of the islands most vibrant.
- Gol sugar refinery, one of the island's last remaining active sugar mills.

- Musée de Villèle, in the family home of a plantationowner, provides an insight into the history of Réunion.
- Kélonia, scientific observatory dedicated to the protection and reproduction of Indian Ocean sea turtles.
- Piton de la Fournaise, one of the world's most active volcanoes, it is easily accessible with suitable equipment.
- · Takamaka waterfalls, a spectacular natural site.
- Cirque de Mafate, only accessible on foot, a must-see for hikers!
- Small Creole villages, dotted all over the island, in the Cirques (Salazie, Mafate and Cilaos), nestled between sea and mountains.
- Grande Anse, a white sandy beach fringed with palm trees. For more information, consult the Reunion Tourist Office website: https://www.reunion.fr



MARCH

• Les Francofolies de La Réunion, highlighting the creativity of musical talents from the French-speaking world, all different styles from all over the world.

APRIL

• Nuits sans Lumière (nights without light), all over the island to raise awareness and fight light pollution (25 nights led by over 130 institutions and private partners).

MAY

- Pint of Science, a European initiative for learning about research in atypical venues.
- La Nuit européenne des Musées (European Museum Night) offers an opportunity to discover museums and other cultural sites all over the island in a new light!
- Festisable, major event bringing together all the sports in Le Tampon region.

JUNE

- Sakifo Musik Festival in St-Pierre, the largest music festival in La Réunion and the Indian Ocean.
- Fête de la Musique: Music everywhere in town (free concerts).

JULY - AUGUST

- The traditional Fêtes de St-Paul, flea market, dances, fireworks, funfair and musical evenings.
- Big Up 974, a multidisciplinary event in St-Denis celebrating urban cultures (free access).
- The CimasaRun, a trail race across the 3 cirques, one of the longest-running and most popular races in Reunion.
- Clameur des Bambous, major musical event in St-Benoît, open to all musical styles.
- Fête de la Vanille in Ste-Suzanne, a 5-day celebration of one of La Réunion's most emblematic plants.

SEPTEMBER

- Journée d'accueil des étudiants internationaux at Université de la Réunion, with a student party in the evening.
- **Jeudi CampusTour,** every Thursday, tutors at the Université de La Réunion take international students on a tour of the Campus so they get to know it better.
- Les Journées du Patrimoine (heritage days), free visits of cultural venues.
- Manapany Festival, the longest-running music festival in La Réunion based around the surfing community in St-Joseph, concerts and sporting challenges.
- Festival Réunion Métis, seafront event in St-Paul around the theme of "living together".

OCTOBER

- The Grand Raid, legendary 100-mile race which is hugely popular in La Réunion.
- Creole Week, celebrating creole music, culture and gastronomy all over the island.

NOVEMBER

- Science Festival, held in 3 Science Villages, in collaboration with the University laboratories.
- St-Pierre Short Film Festival, film showings, meetings with actors and directors, open-air film evening.

DECEMBER

- On December 20, the entire island celebrates Fèt Kaf, to commemorate the abolition of slavery which took place on December, 20 1848.
- December, 31 15,000 visitors spend New Year's Eve on the beach at L'Hermitage.
