

A mutualized one-stop, the Students Welcome Desk

In September and October, the Students Welcome Desk will be available to guide you as soon as you arrive in Saint-Etienne, to advise you and support you with your administrative procedures and with settling in.

Both French and English-speaking staff will be on call to inform, guide and support international students with questions related to healthcare, accommodation, daily life, residence permits, etc.

The Students Welcome Desk will be available at la Comète from 28 August to 13 October 2023, on Tuesdays from 9 am to 1 pm and on Thursdays from 1 pm to 5 pm.

Hosting International Scientists

Every institution has set up a specific hosting programme for foreign doctoral students and researchers and their families. This programme ensures they receive support with all the procedures related to preparing their stay and ensuring it goes well (accommodation, residence permit, healthcare, exploring the city activities in English...). ACCOMMODATION

Finding somewhere to live is not always easy.

Rents are often high, and landlords require financial quarantees (such as a deposit).

Nevertheless, there is a wide range of accommodation on offer: halls of residence that are exclusively reserved for students and managed by the CROUS, student halls and private lodgings, rooms in private homes, flatshares...

The main thing is to start preparing for this as early as possible, before leaving your home country.

GETTING AROUND



To get to Saint-Étienne, Châteaucreux train station, you can take a direct train from Paris (3 hours) or from another location.

You can also arrive directly at Lyon Saint-Exuperv International Airport, and then take the Blablacar Bus shuttle from the airport or the Rhône Express shuttle and then the train leaving from Part Dieu station.



From the train station to Tréfilerie - Université Jean-Monnet campus, take Tramway T3 towards Hôpital nord-Bellevue and get out at the Campus Tréfilerie stop.



For getting around the city and surrounding

area, use the public transportation (bus and tramway) network managed by Stas: https://www.reseau-stas.fr/ Public transport passes cost 10 €/month for students.

Confirm Registration

Take note! Even if you have a pre-registration letter, you are not officially enrolled. You must confirm your enrollment with the institution's Service de la Scolarité (Admissions) as soon as you arrive.

RESIDENCE PERMITS

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

 If you have just arrived in France on a longterm VLS-TS student visa: you must validate it online as soon as you arrive in France, on the ANEF (Administration numérique pour les Etrangers en France - Digital Administration for Foreigners in France) website. This validation must be carried out within the three months following your arrival: https://administrationetrangers-en-france.interieur.gouv.fr/ particuliers/#/

• If you have Algerian citizenship or you are a student holding a "concours" visa or a visa bearing the mention "carte à solliciter dans les deux mois" ("card to be requested within two months"): your request for a residence permit must be carried out at the Préfecture.

 If you hold a "mineur scolarisé" ("minor in education") visa and you have since attained your majority, you must request a residence permit directly on the ANEF website or at the préfecture of your place of residence within the two months following your attaining the age of legal majority: https://administrationetrangers-en-france.interieur.gouv.fr/ particuliers/#/

Please note: if you wish to renew your residence permit or VLS-TS, you must make your request during the third month preceding the date of end of validity of your current residence permit, on the following website: https://administrationetrangers-en-france.interieur.gouv.fr/ particuliers/#/

PRACTICAL INFORMATION /

OPENING A BANK ACCOUNT

If you stay in France for more than 3 months, it will be much easier day-to-day if you open a bank account, **online or in one of the bank agencies located in Saint-Étienne**.

In France, opening a bank account is a right: www.service-public.fr > Argent > Comptes bancaires> Droit au compte

ACCESSING HEALTHCARE

Accessing healthcare in France is almost free, but you must be insured. **You must therefore be** registered with the national health insurance programme.

As a student, you can also take advantage of the university medical services. In these health centers where consultations are free, you will be greeted by a team of doctors, nurses and social workers who can give personalized advice about health and prevention.

TAKING OUT COMPLEMENTARY HEALTH INSURANCE ("MUTUELLE")

We recommend you take out complementary health insurance in order to cover the totality of your healthcare costs, which are not all covered by the compulsory and free national health insurance programme.

Please note: options and levels of insurance vary from one insurer to another. In order to choose the complementary insurance that is best adapted to your situation and your budget, you can access more information on a student "mutuelles" price comparison website.

HOUSING INSURANCE

In France, housing insurance is mandatory.

The "garantie risques locatifs" - rental risk guarantee

- is housing insurance which you can you subscribe with your bank or a private insurance company. Online subscription is also often possible.

EMERGENCY NUMBERS

SAMU: Call 15 Service d'Aide Médicale Urgente - Emergency Medical Services

Police emergency: Call 17 in the event of violence, theft, robbery.

Fire Department: Call 18 in the event of fire, gas leak, water damage, natural catastrophe, or traffic accident.

Call 112: European emergency services number that's accessible from anywhere in the European Union in addition to the French numbers above.

FINDING A JOB OR WORK EXPERIENCE PLACEMENT

It is important that you have sufficient financial resources to come and study in France.

Working in France as a foreign student is possible within limits, namely for a maximum duration of 964 hours per year. This can therefore only be a way of earning **supplementary funds**.

Please note: to work in France, if you are not a citizen of the European Union, you must hold a valid **student residence permit.**

CULTURE AND NIGHTLIFE

• Saint-Étienne offers many ways to cultivate yourself or party. Theaters, movie theaters, concerts, museums, exhibitions, and festivals are on the program and most of the time, at reduced cost for students: http://www.Saint-Étienne.fr/talents

• In Saint Etienne, www.saintepass.fr is a site which lists all the best deals for young people! It allows you to take advantage of free cultural and sporting activities: Movie theaters, concerts, theaters, operas, sports matches, exhibitions, festivals, museums. This service is for young people up to age 25. It is offered by the City of Saint-Étienne in partnership with 80 cultural and sports institutions.

• At Université Jean-Monnet, you have the advantage of a Carnet Culture, a culture notebook containing coupons which can be used in 60 partner cultural sites in the Saint-Étienne Metropolitan area (book stores, theaters, performance centers, movie theaters, and museums): You can also access various cultural offers throughout the year. • In Saint-Étienne for entertainment or to pick up some culture, you can choose from:

4 large movie theaters with multiple screens including one art house theater, Le Méliès, and the municipal Cinémathèqie (student rates, rewards cards, free with the Saintépass: www.saintepass.fr).
5 major museums (reduced student rates) including the Museum of Modern and Contemporary Art, with an important collection of contemporary works, and the Cité du Design. Saint-Étienne is the French city designated "Creative city for design" by UNESCO: https://www.citedudesign.com//fr/home/

- around ten performance halls, theaters, opera, and a **Center for Scientific, Technical, and Industrial Culture,** the Rotonda, installed within the Saint-Étienne École Nationale Supérieure des Mines (School of Mines).

- a dozen book stores, including an institution, Librairie de Paris, opened in 1961.

TOP ATTRACTIONS /

In 2000, Saint-Étienne was the first French city to be awarded the label Ville d'art et d'histoire (Town of Art and History) for its industrial heritage.

• The Art and Industry Museum, to plunge into the industrial and social context of the Saint-Étienne region (reduced rates).

• The Cité du Design, located in the former Saint-Étienne Arms Manufacture (student rates).

• Musée d'Art Moderne et Contemporain, an international institution in the field of modern and contemporary art with over 20,000 works.

• The Couriot Shaft, the Mining park museum, a former mining shaft transformed into an industrial and mining museum with recreation of the mine galleries.

• Geoffroy-Guichard stadium: This stadium is a legend in France! Visit the Verts Museum and you'll learn why.

• Square Jean-Jaurès, a tree-lined and floral square with its basin and music gazebo which comes alive during the summer.

• Saint-Étienne Planetarium, with an exceptional astronomical simulation video apparatus (reduced rates).

• Le Corbusier site in Firminy, at 15 km from Saint-Étienne, the largest building complex in France and Europe created by the famous architecture.

• La boucle verte: a 30 km walk around the town and its surroundings.

• The beaches of Saint-Victor-sur-Loire (a watersports centre), a 30-minute bus ride from the centre of town.

• The snowy slopes of Chalmazel (a ski station an hour away from Saint-Etienne).

• Festival Arkomik, the largest gathering for humor in France (reduced rates).

MARCH

• International Design Biennial, a major design event in France.

• Festival des Curieux Voyageurs, the festival for curious travelers, a film festival for travelers and explorers with multiple events (reduced rates).

APRIL

· Printemps Etudiant du Développement Durable,

in your institution, on the university's campuses and beyond: a whole programme aimed at taking action in favour of the ecological transition.

MAY

· Fest'U, the city's must-see university cultural event.

• European Museum Night, another to way to discover museums, and for free.

• Festival Paroles et Musiques, to (re)discover French *chanson.*

JUNE

- Fête de la Musique: Music everywhere in town (free concerts).
- \bullet Trax, a dance festival for hip-hop in all its forms and styles.

• Festival Paroles et Musiques, a festival of French music which has taken place in Saint-Étienne since 1992.

JULY - AUGUST

• Le festival des Roches celtiques, Celtic music.

• The *Couriot Before*, in the park located at the base of the Mining Museum. An open-air dance hall ambiance and musical events.

• Festival des 7 Collines, the 7 Hills multi-disciplinary festival centered on dance and the contemporary circus.

SEPTEMBER

• SASE, Saint-Etienne Accueille Ses Etudiants, a

celebratory and cultural event marking the start of the academic year.

• **The FESTI'VE**, an afternoon to find out all there is to know about student life at the university, in partnership with the CROUS.

• European Researchers Night: Researchers meet the general public.

• Journées du Patrimoine (heritage days), free visits of cultural venues.

OCTOBER

Nuit des étudiants du monde.

• Fête de la science, in numerous locations across town, including the Village des Sciences, with playful spaces for discovery (activities, exhibitions, shows).

NOVEMBER

• The Festival Positive education, five days of electronic music.

• Festival Face-à-Face, an LGBT+ film festival in Saint-Etienne.

DECEMBER

• Marché de Noël (Christmas market) and Sainte-Barbe Festival, a Saint-Étienne tradition with parade and fireworks (the Mining Museum has free visits on this occasion).
